Fulbright U.S. Student Program

- This is the *student* grant, for students from graduating seniors to doctoral candidates
- For self-defined research and other programs in more than 140 different countries
- Campus process: campus deadline = 9/14, final deadline = 10/12
- In touch with applicants from April - October
- Website
- Virtual Campus Visit 4/21 1:00 p.m.



Truman Scholarships

- For juniors planning on a career in public service
- Funds a two-year Master's degree program, plus summer programming
- Campus process: we can nominate up to four applicants
- Campus deadline in early January, final deadline first week of February
- Annual Truman info session in fall semester
- Website



PPIA program

- For juniors and seniors interested in summer service opportunities in Washington, DC and funding for a Master's in public policy/affairs
- geared toward underrepresented students
- Summer Junior Institute programs at four different universities
- Annual PPIA campus visit in fall semester
- Deadline November 15



Lead for America (L4A)

Hometown Fellows Program

- Graduating seniors who want to get into grassroots government
- Two-year commitment
- Provides a salary on top of local government wage (to attract talent)
- Deadline November 15

Schwarzman Scholars Program

(Tsinghua, Beijing)

- Master's degree program
- Tsinghua University known for global-class programs in international leadership
- [Application here](#); [curriculum here](#)
- Final deadline at end of September
- Between 100 – 200 U.S. students chosen; students from Europe and China also apply for same cohort



Knight-Hennessy Scholars Program

(Stanford)

- For graduate study, including JD, MA, MBA, MD, MFA, MS, and PhD programs
- In addition to degree, part of a Scholars cohort with additional programming
- [Review the criteria here.](#) Essentially, social responsibility in addition to academic merit
- U.S. citizens have one competition; other world area regions have their own for same cohort
- Final deadline at end of September



Rangel/Pickering Int'l Affairs Programs

- For students interested in the U.S. Foreign Service
- Funds a to a two-year graduate program
- Both Rangel and Pickering graduate programs have deadline in mid-September
- Graduating seniors and alumni can apply
- Rangel also offers a Summer Enrichment Program, for sophomores to seniors, deadline February 1
- Both very generous: up to \$37500 annually for two years
- No campus process, but come see us!



Gaither Junior Fellows Program

- For graduating seniors and recent alumni
- Paid position as research assistant to a Fellow at the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace
- One of ten different research projects
- Application = printable PDF (*Old school*)
- Campus deadline is mid-December annually; we can nominate as many as we choose
- Institutional deadline is January 15 annually
- Fellowship Office mails in the application with our endorsement



Rhodes Scholarship to Oxford

- You must apply to an Oxford University graduate program on your own, concomitant with the Rhodes application
- Complex application, including five – eight recommenders, some for character (not academic)
- July 1 annual deadline
- Interview with President Jo Ann Rooney (!)
- Final deadline is Wednesday, October 6
- 32 scholars from U.S; IL/OH = District 10
- DACA students can apply



Marshall/Mitchell Scholarships

(U.K./Ireland)

- You must apply to a U.K. university graduate program for the Marshall, or an Irish graduate program for the Mitchell
- Campus deadline is **July 1** annually
- Interview with President Jo Ann Rooney (!)
- Annual deadlines for Marshall and Mitchell always end of September



General advice

- Use as many resources as you can
 - Award website, including social media
 - Fellowship Office
 - Academic advisors and professors
- Give yourself plenty of time
 - Set a personal deadline before official deadline
 - Plan to write *at least* eight to twelve drafts
- Re-apply if still eligible
