Administrative History

The Correspondence Study Division, originally called the Home Study Division, was founded in 1922 by Reverend Frederick Siedenburg, S.J., and began with ten courses. The division was founded "in order to furnish the opportunity for study and development to men and women unable to attend the school as resident students". Students could earn college credit for classes completed and accomplished a regular resident class's worth of work via the mail. Since Loyola was one of the first Catholic universities in the country to offer courses by correspondence, the division became very popular with missionaries, priests, and nuns.

In 1923 Father Agnew, S.J., then president of Loyola University Chicago, sought to have the Home Study Division recognized nationally. Father Agnew, S.J. sent out letters to universities across the nation asking that credit given via the Home Study Division be recognized at universities outside Loyola. The universities queried replied that they would accept Home Study credits, with the understanding that no more than thirty semester hours could be applied toward a degree.

Miss Marie Sheehan, a graduate of Loyola, was appointed as the first director of the Home Study Division. During her thirty-one year tenure, she developed higher teacher and student standards, increased the number of courses available, expanded enrollment across the globe, and arranged for Home Study to become a cooperating college of the United States Armed Forces Institute. Miss Sheehan's successor, Miss Mary Louise McPartlin also expanded the division. In 1952, Home Study Division was admitted to the National University Extension Association and become a member of the International Conference for Correspondence Education in 1953. By 1955 courses in Philosophy and Physics were televised on local NBC stations for students, in addition to

the ever expanding set of mail correspondence courses available. The Home Study Division name officially changed to the Correspondence Study Division in 1968 and stayed as such until the dissolution of the program.

Though enrollment topped 1,600 students in 1975, the Correspondence Study Division was officially terminated on May 2, 1983. Due to lagging finances the program stopped accepting new students in 1983. Students already enrolled were permitted to finish their courses and the program officially ended all services in 1985.

Scope and Content

The Correspondence Study Division records consist of 34.25 linear feet and spans the years 1922-1985. The collection consists of annual reports, governing body documents, expense reports, faculty salary agreements, income studies, tuition payment ledgers, course catalogs, correspondence, course materials, admission applications, statistics, and transcripts. Series are arranged either chronologically or alphabetically.

Series 1: History, 1923-1984, n.d., Box 1

This series contains documents related to the history of the division including exhibit photographs, publicity clippings, information about Director Mary Louise McPartlin, the division name change, and the phasing out of the Correspondence Study Division. This series is arranged chronologically.

Series 2: Annual Reports, 1952-1984, Box 2

This series contains annual reports and is arranged chronologically.

Series 3: Governing Body Documents, 1927-1983, n.d., Box 2

This series contains master forms, national association memberships, meeting minutes, positions descriptions, and procedures manuals. This series is arranged chronologically.

Series 4: Financial, 1922-1952, Boxes 3 – 5

This series contains ledgers of tuition payments. Note that some ledgers are fragile.

Series 5: Faculty, 1921-1952, Box 6

This series contains records of faculty members for the Correspondence Study Division. This series is arranged alphabetically.

Series 6: Course Catalogs, 1923-1983, Box 6

This series contains the course catalogs for the division. Please note that this run is not complete. This series is arranged chronologically.

Series 7: Course Materials, 1939-1983, n.d., Boxes 7 – 28

This series contains materials used for courses, including syllabi, reading lists, written assignments, course readers, and exams. This series is arranged alphabetically by course name, then numerically within each course and contains one subseries.

Subseries 7-A: TV Course Materials, 1955-1959, n.d.

Contains course materials specific to the televised classes. Materials include syllabi, reading lists, written assignments, course readers, and exams.

Series 8: Admissions Applications, 1921-1938, Boxes 29 – 37

This series contains student admissions applications and course enrollments. This series is arranged alphabetically.

<u>Series 9: Correspondence, 1923-1999, Boxes 37 – 38</u>

This series contains division correspondence including other universities correspondence about accepting Correspondence Study Division credits, general correspondence, direct correspondence with James Chan Hong-Hung, and correspondence related to the division's TV courses.
