#### **University Archives & Special Collections**

Each fiscal year the Loyola University Chicago Archives & Special Collections continues to increase access to collections while at the same time working on special projects, acquiring more collections, supervising interns and volunteers, and promoting the use of the archives and rare book collections. FY 14 was no exception to this trend, especially with increases in faculty members using the archives for class and internship projects as well as participation in exhibitions at the Loyola University Museum of Art (LUMA). Total research inquiries went up by 11% over FY13 with a significant increase of inquires coming from Loyola faculty, staff, and students; the number of acquisitions decreased by 68% along with a 47% decrease in the actual number of linear feet acquired; the number of items in digital collections increased by 11%; and the number of presentations by staff to classes, departments, and schools increased by 33%.

#### Access

Providing access to collections continues to be the primary focus of the archives and special collections department. In order to accomplish this staff members continue to add catalog records for archival collections and rare books to OCLC and Loyola's OPAC and finding aids continue to be made available online in PDF format. In addition catalog records in the OPAC and OCLC continue to be updated and corrected as necessary.

#### **Catalog Records**

Four hundred and seventy-six (476) records were added to the OPAC during FY14, a 170% increase over FY13. Of these, seven (7) records were for archival collections, eighteen (18) were original book records, and eight (8) records were corrected. The remaining four hundred forty-three (443) were copy-catalog book records, mainly for books from the Michalak Edward Gorey collection.

#### **Finding Aids**

Twenty-six (26) finding aids were created and/or converted from legacy format and put online, a decrease of 75% from FY13. This number is in-line with the more typical output of the department, unlike the FY13 number which reflected the conversion of 83 legacy finding aids for the Schoder slide collection to PDFs.

#### **Digital Collections**

During FY14 two hundred ninety-seven (297) items were added to the digital collections in CONTENTdm. This number includes the digitization of 80 volumes from the rare book collection now available online. The Archives & Special collections CONTENTdm collections now include 3,070 items, which were viewed a total of 8,610 times. The number of items added to CONTENTdm collections breaks down as follows:

#### **Acquisitions**

The total number of acquisitions decreased 68% from 62 to 20 and the total number of linear feet acquired decreased 47% from 243.35 to 129.11. This decrease demonstrates the reduction in large single collections acquired during FY14. Notable acquisitions for FY14 include:

Acquisitions of electronic records during FY14 totaled 546MB (.53308 GB).

#### **Processing**

During FY14 approximately 99.75 linear feet was processed, a decrease of 18%. This decrease in the total linear feet processed corresponds to the increase in work on special projects, specifically work on the C is for Chicago – G is for Gorey exhibit at LUMA and work with Dina Berger's class on an exhibit pertaining to the Cold War and how it was perceived at Loyola. #### Reference

Archives & Special Collections received nine hundred ninety (990) reference inquiries during FY14, an increase of 11% over FY13. Both internal Loyola and external researcher requests grew with the total number of internal reference inquiries topping those of external inquiries 541 to 449, reflecting the increase in inquiries and usage by Loyola students. Once again most in-person researchers requested archival collections. Four ILL requests were fulfilled for copies of rare books or pages from rare books. Among the inquiries received where ones from researchers in England and New Zealand requesting information from the autograph collections, one from a researcher in Canada requesting information from the Jean Delanglez, S.J., papers and one from a researcher in the Philippines requesting a copy of a rare book. The request from the Philippines came from a researcher who located the book in the Catholic Research Resources Alliance (CRRA) portal and was fulfilled by digitizing the book and making it available through CONTENTdm.

#### **Oral History Project**

During FY14 the Oral History Project graduate assistant conducted thirty-two (32) interviews with twenty-nine (29) people. Among the people interviewed during the year were Rev. Michael J. Garanzini, S.J., Dr. John Pelissero, Wayne Magdziarz, Dr. John Frendries, School of Business Dean Kathleen Getz, former College of Arts & Sciences Dean Frank Fennell, Jr., former College of Arts & Sciences Dean Kathleen McCourt, and Patti Ray, former director of Hillel.

#### **Outreach**

Social media, presentations, and assisting with exhibitions at the Loyola University Museum of Art continue to be the foundation for outreach conducted by the staff of the Archives & Special Collections department. Usage of Facebook and Twitter as outreach tools continues to grow although posting on the blog has decreased and may be discontinued. The most popular posting on Facebook was the image of Senator John F. Kennedy, Cardinal Stritch, and Loyola President Fr. Maguire, S.J, in 1956. This posting reached 8,334 people.

Presentations to classes, departments, and schools continue to increase. During FY14 presentations about the archives were made to twelve classes and one presentation was made to the Libraries' own Collections Management Committee. A total of 182 people attended the presentations. Class presentations include those for History 397 (History Honors Colloquium), History 410 (Special topics – Jesuit Restoration), Theology undergraduate and graduate students introduction to the archives sessions, History 291 (Historical Methods), History 410 (Material Culture), and History 300E (Cold Wars in the Americas).

Exhibits continue to be a primary outreach vehicle for Archives & Special Collections. During FY13 the department created an exhibit on athletics at Loyola in the Donovan Reading Room. This exhibit highlighted all athletics at Loyola, both past and present, but centered on the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the NCAA Basketball Championship and the Loyola-

Mississippi State 'game of change'. The next exhibit in the reading room was the "Highlights of the Thomas Michalak collection", which spotlighted the collection of 19<sup>th</sup> century British satire broadsides and books donated by Tom Michalak to Special Collections in 2009 as well as the new Edward Gorey collection donated in 2013. During the year the two cases outside of the reading room had exhibits on John F. Kennedy, for the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of his assassination, and an exhibit on the Cold War and Loyola. The Cold War and Loyola exhibit was put together by the History 300E class with the assistance of the archivists, and used materials from the University Archives.

In addition to exhibits in Cudahy Library, the staff of the Archives & Special Collections department collaborated with the staff of the Loyola University Museum of Art on two exhibits. The first exhibit "C is for Chicago: G is for Gorey" used materials from the Michalak Edward Gorey collection to highlight Gorey's life as a working artist. The second exhibit "Crossings & Dwellings: Restored Jesuits, Women Religious, and the American Experience, 1814-2014" highlights Jesuits and Women Religious in North America after the Jesuit restoration. A companion exhibit to this is "Song in Stone: The Construction of Madonna della Strada Chapel", which uses items from the Melville Steinfels papers, University Photograph Collection, and Madonna della Strada records. These exhibits opened July 19, 2014.

#### **Special Projects**

#### **Restoration 2014**

The Archives & Special Collections department contributed to an exhibit on Jesuits in America called "Crossings & Dwellings: Restored Jesuits, Women Religious, and the American Experience, 1814-2014" which opened at LUMA on July 19, 2014. In particular the staff was responsible for curating the 1<sup>st</sup> library catalog project gallery while Dr. Kyle Roberts was out of town for the summer. In addition to the library project, staff selected historical photographs and created labels to be used in the gallery. Staff has also assisted on the companion exhibit "Song in Stone: The Construction of Madonna della Strada Chapel", which was created from items in the Melville Steinfels papers, University Photograph Collection, and Madonna della Strada records.

#### **Chicago Collections Consortium**

Archives staff has submitted information on items for a potential consortium exhibition being planned by the CCC program committee.

#### History 300E: Cold Wars in the Americas (Dr. Dina Berger)

Staff assisted students in Dr. Berger's class with research in Loyola records on the attitude towards the Cold War on campus. When the research was completed, staff assisted the class with creating and mounting an exhibit based on their findings in the standing cases by the Donovan Reading Room. In the spring and summer Archives staff assisted Dr. Berger and by providing scanned images for a presentation at the Weekend of Excellence and copies of the Ellacuria visit video tapes for a website to be created for the 2014 Ignatian month.

#### **Edward Gorey Exhibit**

From February to June of 2014 the Loyola University Museum of Art presented the Edward Gorey *Elegant Enigmas* exhibition. Archives staff assisted in the creation of the companion exhibit "C"C is for Chicago: G is for Gorey".

#### **Institute of Pastoral Studies 50th Anniversary**

Archives staff continues to work with Dr. Peter Gilmour on a 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary booklet to be published in 2015.

#### **Congressional Archives**

#### Access

During FY14 the majority of the Rostenkowski papers were opened to researchers. Only one series requires more work in order to be usable by researchers – the constituent/subject correspondence series. This series will be opened by the end of the fall 2014 semester. In addition, pre-processing planning for the Henry Hyde papers has begun. The Hyde papers will be open to researchers on October 6, 2016.

#### Acquisition

No new materials were acquired for either the Rostenkowski or the Hyde papers.

#### **Processing**

One hundred thirty-six (136) linear feet were processed during FY14.

#### Reference

Four phone inquiries and nine email inquiries were received and handled by the Political Papers archivist. Ten in-person visits were made to conduct research using the Rostenkowski papers.

#### **Outreach**

The Political Papers Archivist did not conduct any outreach to promote the Rostenkowski collection during FY14.

#### **Special Accomplishments**

There were no special accomplishments for FY14.
