Biographical Sketch

Sister Helen Jarrell was born on October 28, 1879, in Burnt Hills, Ontario, Canada. She joined the order of the Religious Hospitallers of St. Joseph, in Kingston, Ontario, in 1899 and took her first vows in 1901. In 1903 Archbishop Quigley invited the Religious Hospitallers of St. Joseph to establish a mission in Chicago. Sister Jarrell and six other members of the order came to Chicago and founded St. Bernard's Hospital in 1905.

From 1905 to 1916 Sister Jarrell served as an operating room nurse at St. Bernard's, then affiliated with Loyola University. After becoming the director of St. Bernard's School of Nursing, Sister Jarrell continued her education and earned a Bachelor of Science and Master of Arts in Nursing Education. In 1935 she was appointed the Directress of the new Loyola University School of Nursing. In 1939 the title of Directress was changed to Dean of the School of Nursing. Sr. Jarrell served as Directress/Dean until 1947 when she retired. Sr. Jarrell passed away February 24, 1951.

Scope and Content

The Sr. Helen Jarrell records span from approximately 1935 to 1947 and were created by the Loyola University School of Nursing, the Public Health Nursing Program, the University Registrar, and the six hospital nursing schools that originally comprised Loyola's School of Nursing. These records include correspondence; constitutions and by-laws; minutes and agendas; reports; diplomas; applications; course descriptions and curriculum information; and grant information.

The records in this collection have been removed from several separate accessions transferred by the School of Nursing. They have then been arranged chronologically to present the development of the School of Nursing.
