Executive Committee:

Academic Affairs Committee:

- The Academic Affairs Committee is pushing forward with the student feedback website initiative. We are in the process of getting together a proposal for funding from Jane. Additionally, we are working on an initiative that involves diversifying the core curriculum that offers more history and theology courses. We have also decided to focus on promoting the textbooks on reserve in the library for our textbook affordability initiative. In terms of the final's schedule, there is a board that is examining the effects of the change in the finals schedule, which we will be receiving updates on. Our focus is on trying to extend the move out period on the last day of finals so that students will have more time to pack with less stress and a lower likelihood of fines. We will be collaborating with RCDC on this effort.
