Whereas,	The Student Government of Loyola Chicago, hereafter referred to as SGLC, recommends that Loyola University Chicago offer American Sign Language, hereafter referred to as ASL, as an accredited course at Loyola University Chicago, and

Whereas,	Loyola American Sign Language Club, a Registered Student Organization, was created, in part, to stimulate the conversation about a potential ASL
	class, and

Whereas.	Since the beginning of the 2017-2018 academic year, over 70 students
	have shown interest in the ASL club and learning the language, and

Whereas,	Dr. Jacqueline Long, the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs,
	acknowledged that ASL is an accepted foreign language, but is not
	currently offered by Loyola University Chicago, and

Whereas,	The Department of Modern Languages requires that 12 students commit to
	taking an ASL class before one could be created, and

Whereas,	33 undergraduate students signed a paper petition indicating that, should
	a class be created for the Fall 2018 semester, they would be willing to take
	said class, and

Whereas,	388 of the 740 undergraduate students who took the 2018 SGLC survey	
	answered "Yes" to the question, "Would you enroll in an American Sign	
	Language course in the fall semester of 2018 if it was offered as a foreign	
	language credit?", and	

Whereas,	The Chairperson of the Department of Modern Languages, Dr. Susana
	Cavallo, agreed to take on the initiative of creating an ASL class, and

Whereas,	Dr. Cavallo has informed the Academic Affairs Committee that the
	Department of Modern Languages is actively looking into hiring an ASL
	professor, but would not be able to make the class a reality until Spring
	2019, and
